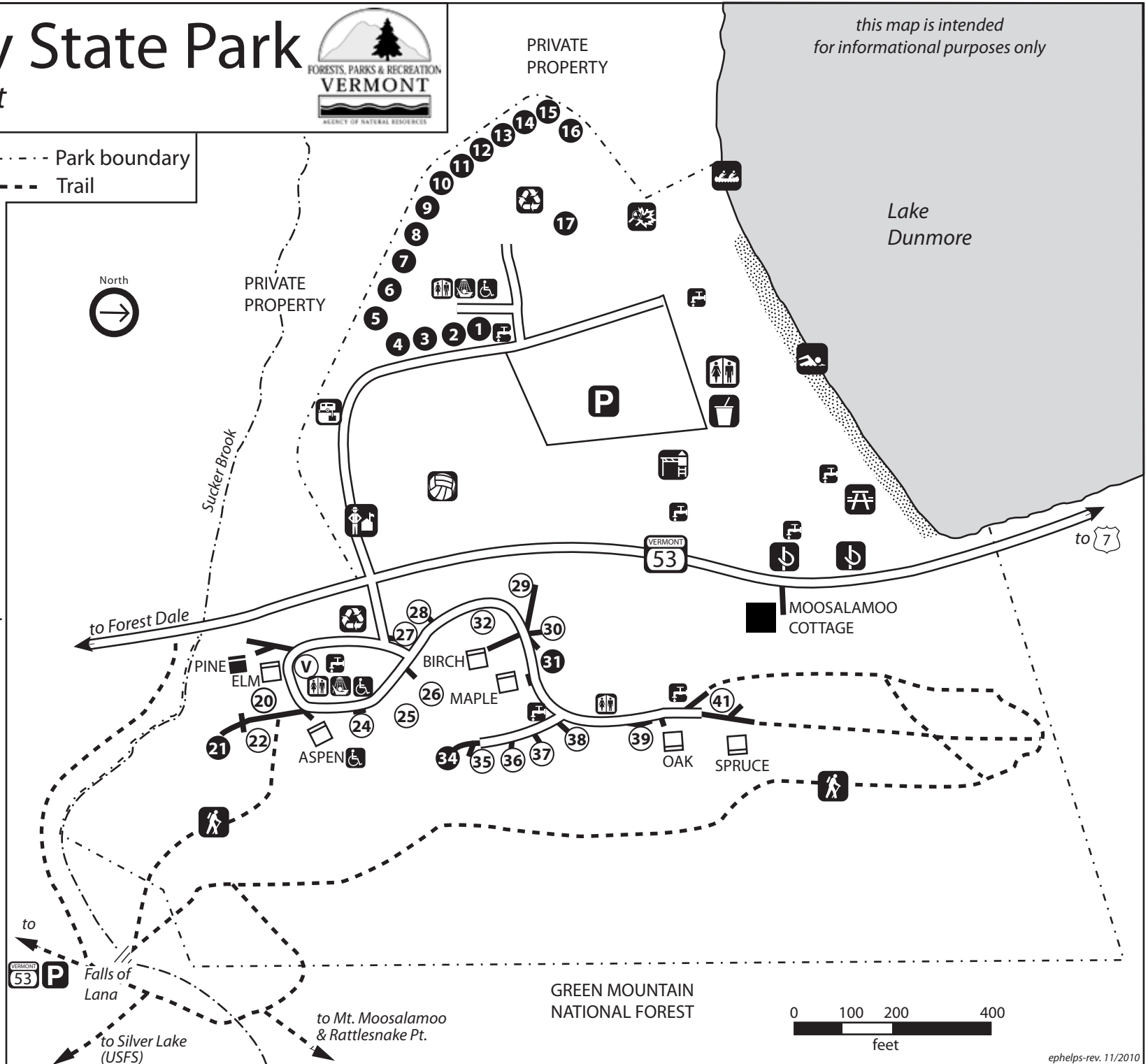

Branbury State Park

Welcome to Branbury State Park on the eastern shore of Lake Dunmore at the base of Mt. Moosalamoo. The Green Mountain National Forest borders the park to the east, giving access to extensive hiking and mountain biking opportunities.

At the turn of the 20th century, 69-acre parcel was farm land. Later a guest house was constructed on the property which became a boys' summer camp and private beach with picnic area. In 1945, it became Branbury (Brandon-Salisbury) State Park.
